Y'all come!

The bicycling tour that has made a tradition of great rest stops and super ride support is back for its **26th year**. This is one fall event you don't want to miss! There is a route for everyone – from families on their first bike tour to dedicated riders wanting to set a personal best on a century ride.

The Routes

10-mile family friendly route goes through beautiful Cameron Park and downtown Waco. There are several rest stops to make it a fun ride for all.

26-mile route is also fun for families and recreational riders. This route is quite flat and passes by the Lake Waco Dam and the peaceful surrounding countryside.

50 & 65-mile routes are relatively flat with a few challenging hills thrown in to keep you from getting bored!

100-mile route takes riders through picturesque countryside on rural roads in McLennan and Bosque counties. The route goes through historic Mother Neff State Park, the oldest state park in Texas. This route also has riders pedal past former President George W. Bush's Crawford Ranch. Although relatively flat, there are some challenging hills to keep your heart pumping.

Again this year, the 50, 65 and 100-mile routes feature a **rest stop at the Mars Snackfood candy factory, home of Skittles®**

Registration - You can register for the Skittles Waco Wild West Century by completing and mailing the form in this flyer, downloading and printing an entry form from our website, or registering online and paying by credit card. Details at <http://www.wacowildwest.com>. Registration is also available the day of the ride beginning at 6:30am.

It's for a good cause - Ride proceeds benefit the **National Marrow Donor Program** and other worthy causes. The WWWC is a non-profit organization.

Packet Pickup & Registration – Fri., Sept. 24 – Waco Convention Center, Ranger Room, 3-9 p.m. Sat., Sept. 25 - Indian Spring Park 6:30 to 8:00 a.m.

Friday Pre-Ride Roundup - A pre-ride party will be held at Indian Spring Park on Friday evening from 6 – 9 p.m. There will be exhibits by local vendors. Snacks will be provided.

Pancake breakfast - Rise and shine Saturday morning with a delicious pancake breakfast at the foot of the historic Waco Suspension Bridge. It's only \$5 per person. Served from 6:30 – 9 a.m.

9th Annual Marrow Drive - Join the **National Bone Marrow Registry** Saturday 10:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. at Indian Spring Park. It just takes a swab to the inside of the mouth - **it doesn't keep you from riding!** The National Marrow Foundation web site is: <http://www.themarrowfoundation.org/>

All day at Indian Spring Park - Prizes will be raffled off at the finish line throughout the day (after you ride, turn in the number stub off your ride number to the registration tent). First aid station near registration tent. Siete Mares Restaurant will be serving a wide variety of food so stay for lunch!

Rest stops - Rest stops will be located every 10 – 15 miles. They will have water, sports drink, cookies, and fruit available. All rest stops are run by local non-profit groups. Prizes will be given to the best rest stops, so be sure and let us know your favorites!

Sag Support - Sag Wagons will patrol the course to help with minor repairs and to transport weary riders back to the start area. Please be prepared to fix your own flat tires (bring a spare tube!)

For your safety and the safety of others riding around you, no headphones allowed. Bicycle helmets are required!

FYI - Beginning at 7:45 a.m., all riders will be staged to leave Indian Spring Park. Ride starts at 8 a.m. beginning with the tandems, the “really fast guys”, the 100, 65, 50, 25 and 10 milers in that order. The bicycle tour will take place rain or shine. No refunds. You're welcome to ride any distance you like, but the course will close at 5 p.m. No ride support will be available after that time. By law (and for the safety and protection of all riders), all traffic laws must be obeyed during the ride.

*Each rider **must complete an entry form** and waiver, family and group registrations **must** be sent together.
